Status and plans

- The RV "Dr. Fridtjof Nansen" is owned by the Norwegian Foreign Aid Directorate (Norad), it is scheduled by FAO in Rome and it is manned and operated by IMR
- The current "Dr. Fridtjof Nansen" needs to be replaced in order to perform "ecosystem approach to fisheries" projects in developing countries in Africa, Asia and Latin-America
- Conceptual design of a new vessel was done in 2012
- Parliament decision to build a new vessel was made in the fall of 2012
- Ship designer contract will be signed on 12 March 2013
- Yard contract is planned to be signed in December 2013
