

New equipment on Árni Friðriksson

On MRI 50th Anniversary in 2015 the government decided (by advice from MRI) to give the nation a "birthday present"; to finish mapping the seabed in the Icelandic EEZ. In 2016 the institute got a special funding for replacement of multibeam as well as subbottom profiler. Tendering process resulted in purchase of Kongsberg Simrad EM302 instead of EM300 (since 2000) and Topas PS18 subbottom profiler. Also the institute got a special funding for operating for about 60 days a year for mapping. In total it will take about 12 years to finish the mapping as only less than 10 % has been mapped from 2001 to 2016.
