1. Operating/Fixed costs

Expenses involved in the day-to-day running of the ship - essentially those costs such as crew, stores and maintenance, insurances, shore staff - that will be incurred whatever campaign the ship is engaged in.

2. Periodic maintenance costs

Incurred when the ship is dry-docked for major repairs. Shipping companies often include a 'dry-docking provision'. Since this is a provision rather than a cash; better treated separately from operating costs

3. Voyage costs

Variable costs associated with a specific voyage and include fuel, port charges, pilot dues, mob/demob

4. Capital costs

May depend on the way the ship has been financed.
